LEGAL AND STATUTORY COMMITTEE

- ▶ Nersa advised that the long awaited Generation Licensing Regulations are due to be released today Friday 10 November 2017
- ▶ The issue of the areas of supply between Eskom and municipalities still remain a problem in spite of the previously involved process of settling such disputes which Eskom had outlined. This does not work.
- ▶ On the SDA, Salga reported that there is still no notable progress on the issue. Now taken over by IMTT.

PUBLICITY AND PAPERS COMMITTEE

- ▶ Preparations for the 2018 Convention were progressing well with the deposit for the venues already paid as is proposed to be at CSIR.
- ▶ A request was made for the suggestion on the theme and subthemes of the upcoming 2018 Convention to be submitted to the secretariat asap.
- ▶ Papers from the PE Convention may now be viewed from the AMEU website

TARIFF COMMITTEE

- ▶ NERSA consultation process on proposed Eskom tariff increase in underway.
- ▶ Municipalities were encouraged to familiarise themselves with the Eskom NMD policy.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

- ▶ Rakesh Maharaj from SIP 10 made presentation on power delivery sustainability specially focusing on the lack of maintenance on distribution infrastructure. He suggested that there be a single centralised information library where municipalities can share and access information.
- ▶ Eskom representative indicated that Eskom now has surplus capacity and encouraged efficient utilisation of the same to promote economic development in the country.
- ▶ Vally reported that there is no movement on the signing of the joint paper between DOE and Human Settlement which seeks to ensure proper coordination between the two departments.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING COMMITTEE

- ▶ Dr Johnson from Eskom Academy of Learning made a presentation outlining different training courses and encouraged the municipalities to consider them and see what is relevant to them and then approach the Academy having considered their SCM processes.
- ▶ A representative from NT gave an update on the progress made in the Infrastructure Skills Development Grant (ISDG).
